A family is a social group of people who stay together under the same roof in a society. It comprises two or more adults like parents and grandparents and young children who are bound in a relationship by birth. They are collectively known as family members. People have many reasons to move from one place to another. . Some movements take place because of marriages, pursuing higher education abroad and transfers in Central Government job. Some families leave their home or native place and move permanently to a new place due to the problems like poor educational facilities, war, worse climatic conditions, lesser employment opportunities, etc.

Migration: The movement of a person or a group of people to settle in another place is called **Migration**. It can be temporary or permanent.

Emigration: means **to leave** one's country to live in another and the people who emigrate are called emigrants.

Immigration: means **to come** into another country to live permanently and the people who immigrate are called immigrants.

Sometimes, during construction of bridges, dams and highways, land is taken away from people. They are then given land somewhere else. This is called **Displacement**. Sometimes, the government demolishes houses and buildings built on unauthorized land. This is called Demolition. The people living in such places have to move to a new place.
