Dr. Kuwarani Ritu Singh Ji, Hon'ble Pro-Vice Chairperson, DPS Jammu in collaboration with JIGER Foundation Jammu initiated the launch of Project Roshni outreach program under 'Prayas Club' for providing computer education to the visually impaired girl children of the Blind School on 1st Feb. 2023. Present on the occasion were the members of the JIGER Foundation Ms. Sandhya Dhar, awrdeee of Nari Shakti Puraskar and founder of JIGER (Jammu Institute of General Education and Rehabilitation), Mr. Akash Dhar, Ms. Vishakha Bhan and Mr. Arun Kumar

along with the Principal-DPS Jammu, Ms. Ruchi Chabra, Headmistress, Ms. Meenu Gupta, Coordinators and other staff members of the school.

The outreach program has been aptly named as "Roshni' after the symbolic significance of the word "Knowledge" which stands from 'moving from darkness to light.' For this purpose, a State of Art computer lab of DPS Jammu will be used to enhance the technical skills of the visually impaired girl children for their better future.

The program started with auspicious chanting of the mantras by the Hon'ble PVC, Dr. Kuwarani Ritu Singh Ji, members of the JIGER Foundation and Team DPS Jammu. This was followed by tree plantation done on the site by the members of Team Roshni.

Addressing the gathering, Dr. Kuwarani Ritu Singh Ji said that outreach program 'Roshni' aims to impart training to visually impaired girls to help them become self dependent and to enhance their abilities to catch up with technologies through modern tools, software to improve their academic performance and thus give them better job opportunities and living conditions.

Speaking on the occasion, Ms. Sandhya Dhar, an Indian Disability Rights Activist, narrated her personal courageous and thought provoking story which sparked a note of inspiration amongst all.

A commendable act of empathy, kindness and foresightedness by Dr. Kuwarani Ritu Singh Ji has thus opened the doors of better future for these girls, under the school's outreach program Prayas Club.









DPS JAMMU CONDUCTS TEN DAYS KNOWLEDGE CAMP




Curriculum (EAC). EAC is a strategy for integrating the teaching of content of others subjects with language learning. Dr. Nikalje also focused on the role of an English teacher in the EAC Strategy and also added that English Language teachers and Content Subject teachers should work towards a common target.


The resource person further added that language skills are important even if a student is studying subjects like Science and Mathematics etc. Teachers must encourage students for reading, writing and speaking in all the areas of the curriculum. Language naturally is present in all areas of learning. Teachers must use all opportunities that curriculum offers for developing language skills. Dr. Nikalje also focused on critical thinking through writing to engage learners in presenting their thoughts in a manner that is different from speech. Writing on a provided text requires that students make important critical choices and ask themselves: - What information is the most important? What might be left out?

The session was extremely valuable. All participants were given an opportunity to clear their queries.









NURTURING CREATIVITY IN THE CLASSROOM-AN EXPLORATION OF CONSENSUS ACROSS THEORY AND PRACTICE



Ms. Anju Choudhary from Delhi Public School Jammu attended a webinar on the topic "Nurturing Creativity in the Classroom-An Exploration of Consensus across Theory and Practice" conducted by Human Resource Development, The Delhi Public School Society. The resource person was Dr. Karen Hosack Janes.

She started her session by focusing on why creative skills are important to encourage in the primary classroom. It is increasingly important to help students to develop their creative skills. She further insisted that machines struggle when tasks are highly

interpretative, they struggle with emulating natural human emotions. Therefore, creative skills will be increasingly valuable in the coming times. It is the essential knowledge that pupils need to be educated citizens, introducing them to the best that has been thought and said, and helping to engender an appreciation of human creativity and achievement. She further introduced Bloom's Taxonomy and explained that the nature of thinking is deeper in experiential learning opportunities.

She further compared highly directed and less directed approaches to teaching and learning. She also shared a website that will encourage pupils curiosity.













FRACTIONAL NUMBER SENSE



Ms. Sakshi Khanna from Delhi Public School Jammu attended a webinar on the Topic "Fractional Number Sense" on 20th July, 2022 organized by The Delhi Public School Society-HRDC. The Resource Person was Ms. Komal from Jodo Gyan, an organization with a mission to do Mathematics with learning by doing.

Ms. Komal introduced the topic with the question where a family had a box of sweets. The family ate One –third of the sweets in the morning

and one fourth at tea time. She asked if the half of sweets were left or not. The participants shared their responses with reasons. She said that it is important to help children to understand fractions. She said that students look at fractions in terms of a Numerator and Denominator but we should encourage them to look at independent quantity. She said that we need to be looking at the problems in terms of LCM, HCF, Addition or Subtraction. The students too should be encouraged to think in terms of relations.

She also demonstrated the teachers' fraction Kit. The resource person gave example of problem based on fractions of seating people at a party. She also demonstrated the game "Cake Poora Karo". The participants enjoyed the game. Then she did an activity with fractions denoting half, in which numerator is half the denominator

Ms. Komal did an activity based on equivalent fractions. With the help of fraction kit she showed how children can visualize fractions. She encouraged the participants we can do a lot of activities that help the child to develop their reasoning, thinking and imaginative skills. Overall, the session was interactive and full of new ideas.

SOCIO EMOTIONAL LEARNING



Ms. Randeep Kaur Bali from Delhi Public School Jammu attended a webinar on the topic 'Socio Emotional Learning' organized by HRDC-DPSS. The resource person was Prof. Asha Singh. She started her session by focusing Social -Emotional Learning (SEL) which is defined as the process through which children and adults learn and apply social skills. Prof. Asha singh also discussed on four types of social & emotional learning i.e. Self Awareness, Self Management, Social Awareness and Relationship skills. The resource person further continued her session by explaining

significance of physical and social independence. She added not to ask your children to strive for extraordinary lives, help them instead to find the wonder and the Marvel of an ordinary life. Prof. Asha Singh also focused on actual age of child to go to school. She added 6 to 11 years compromise stages of child development covered under classes 1 to 6 (the school division). The session was extremely valuable. All the participants were given opportunity to clear their queries. The overall session was very informative.

MAKING MATHS MORE INTERESTING AND INTEGRATING IT WITH OTHER SUBJECTS



Ms. Parvinder Kour from Delhi Public School Jammu attended a webinar on the topic 'Making Maths More Interesting and integrating it with other Subjects' organized by HRDC-DPSS. The resource person was Dr. Sharad Sinha. She started her session by relating Maths with daily life using different competencies like problem solving, critical thinking and decision making, etc. so that the children in the classroom show more interest in Mathematics. Most of the children have Maths anxiety, Maths fear. So she added that being a teacher we should relate Maths with daily life. She also added that Maths should relate with other subjects such as English, Science, S.St etc. She added how we should make all

possible efforts to make Mathematics an enjoyable experience for our own learners. She further motivated teachers and said that teacher is a facilitator who guides their students and children can learn with small activity learning by doing, by recapitulation which is very essential and important part. She also added that before starting the topic we should introduce the topic with learning objectives. She also said that we use Mathematics in our daily life such as while cooking food, we use Ratio, Proportion, fraction, etc. We use Maths in games, like Sudoku, Snakes and Ladders, making numbers, etc. We should help the child to recall shapes and dimensions. When we use different things in different Shapes, it will further help them in learning concepts. Dr. Sharad also demonstrated an activity kit focused on different shapes. She encouraged participants to do a lot of activities that help the child to develop reasoning, thinking skills etc. She also added Scaffold learning is to be implemented for developing in student's competency and skill required for comprehending, identifying, selecting and integrating information. The session was extremely valuable. The overall session was great with very relevant real life illustrations.

STEAM-EDUCATION AND PEDAGOGY: THEORY AND PRACTICE CASE EXAMPLES



Ms. Ritu Amla from Delhi Public School Jammu attended a webinar on the topic "STEAM-Education and Pedagogy: Theory and Practice Case Examples" organized by The DPSS-HRDC. The resource persons were Mr. Jukka Miettunen and Mrs. Sari Saleva.

Mr. Jukka started the session with an introduction on STEAM Education and Pedagogy. STEAM is a cross curricular wholeness including a scientific goal. It's science and technology interpreted through engineering and the arts all based in a language of Mathematics. This pedagogy uses technology, science, and art as approaches to teaching student's self-direction, interaction skills and critical thinking. The goal is to cultivate

persistent, responsible, cooperative and courageous problem solvers. He focused upon bringing in real life challenges, co-operative skills, adapting modern technology and $21^{\rm st}$ century skills into our education system and curriculum. He then talked about various industrial revolutions and how the $4^{\rm th}$ revolution will help our students to engage in a world alongside smart machines and advanced technology.

He further explained the STEAM Pedagogy as:

S - Science

T -Technology

E - Engineering

A - Art

M - Maths


STEAM-Education emphasizes on teaching cross curricular subjects and 21^{st} century skills. It deepens understanding and has impact for learning results. STEAM teaching is most successful when it is a part of the school's curriculum work.

STEAM Pedagogy helps students:

- To ask questions
- Make conclusions and connecting things together
- Being innovative and thinking creatively

Later in the session Mrs. Sari Saleva joined and took special effort to make us understand the enhanced role that we as teachers need to play in bringing art integrated education with 21st century skills in our curriculum. She gave various examples on how to bring in creativity and art in students learning. She further explained that STEAM is an educational framework that brings reality into the classroom. She concluded by explaining the importance of creativity and art and how different point of views of students can enlarge their horizons and thinking abilities.

The webinar finally ended with doubt clearing session. It was really a wonderful session on STEAM-Education.



LITTLE ADVENTURES, BIG CONNECTIONS: CONNECTING CHILDREN WITH NATURE



Ms. Sargam Gandotra from Delhi Public School Jammu attended a webinar on the topic "Little Adventures, Big Connections: Connecting Children with Nature" organized by The DPSS-HRDC. There are many benefits of storytelling for young children as stories strengthen language, increase attention span, improve memory retention, inculcate creativity, and build emotional understanding.

Ms. Rukumini Ramachandran said that stories are a very intrinsic part of what teachers do for children. Teachers should find new inspiration and happiness to examine the story that children need. She added that storytelling has existed since the earliest of times. Sharing thoughts and experiences must have been the beginning of telling stories. Stories began with the commencement of oral learning. Life was so difficult that stories must have created bridges of joy. Stories teach children about places that they have not visited and help them to connect with people. Stories present common backgrounds and emotions. Every story gives an insight and a new point that was earlier not there.

Ms. Rukumini Ramachandran continued and said that the stories revolve around human actions. In the centre of the story lies a very profound action that comes from the human mind. The Plot of a story centres around the action of a character. Character unfolds the action. The children should interact with the character internally. They need to understand the relationship of the central character with others.

Ms. Ruby added that young children love to hear stories that happened to them. Reality based stories are what children might experience as human beings. At the age of 3 to 4 years, stories need to be reality-based and imaginary and at 6 to 12 years stories can be magical.

Ms. Ruby said that an aspect that appeals to children of 2 to 6 years of age besides expressions and actions is repetition, as repetitions allow the children to follow the action till they understand the story. They use repetition to find security and what happens next. She said stories should be narrated with actions. Teachers should make imaginary stories only from the life around. Anything can be a story and the details have to be repeated.

Ms. Rukumini Ramachandran added that reading a story does not have the freedom of an oral story. Words have power in storytelling. The story must be told without explanations, as far as possible, as it kills the story, the enjoyment of the reader should be transferred to the child. She said that books should be read with respect and love and illustrations should be shown to the children. The Montessori belief is that young children, especially toddlers, learn best through reality (concrete) rather than fantasy (abstract). When children begin to fully understand the difference between reality and fantasy, fairy tales and fantasy books become more appropriate. She also said that there should be a book corner and what matters is the number of books on the shelves and the way the books are displayed. Teachers should not point out the words and should give children an opportunity to enjoy the story. Building a library in class is the greatest gift teachers can give to the children. A Library is a physical and spiritual space. She added that Storytelling is the interactive art of using words and actions to reveal the elements and images of a story while encouraging the listener's imagination.

Ms. Rukumini Ramachandran said that while telling a story the storytellers may follow the text from a book or may choose to use their own words. Teachers should not worry that they need acting lessons to tell stories. Children remember the words by hearing them said over and over again.

RAISING SELF-MOTIVATED CHILDREN



Ms. Rashmi Sharma from Delhi Public School Jammu attended an online webinar on the topic 'Raising Self-Motivated Children' organized by The DPSS-HRDC, New Delhi on 15th Sept. 2022. The resource persons were Ms. Rukmini Ramachandran, Ms. Ruby Lau, Ms. Ramya Sridhar and Ms. Hemalatha Ranga from The Delhi Public School Society, New Delhi.

The webinar was very informative and the discussion was very important as the topics were about Raising self-motivated children, encouraging children, giving children liberty to choose and understanding their emotional behaviour.

The panel emphasized on the nature of motivation and the role of responsibility towards the students. They threw light on how one can live to achieve something. How can we wisely act as one of the contributing members in the society. Discussion was carried forward based on child's need, their emotional behaviour and also verbal conversation. The main focus was on children, as they need continuous motivation so that they can move forward. Every child needs to be appreciated in the form of smileys, stars, hugs etc. These small rewards will lead to wonder. They laid stress on freedom to choose and the importance of self discipline to work systematically and instilling in them to get self motivated. They also discussed the do's and don'ts which we as a teacher need to take into consideration while dealing with the children in the classroom.

FORMATION PEDAGOGIQUE

Various solvents can be discarded in number of reactions and thereby decrease waste & increase atomic efficiency. Dr. Sengupta of Miranda House-Delhi suggested use of microtest technique & test without wasting fuel or LPG.

Case study on legal painkiller such as Ibrufin was taken into discussion where green chemistry made it possible to reduce six steps reactions into three steps with no waste. Aspects of DDT and its synthetic route discussed with case study too.

In conclusion, green chemistry focues on reducing waste, energy and cost. All technique will help students and teachers to make practicals interesting. It is green chemistry that shows a suitable synthesis with microsale use and removal of pollutants and inorganic contaminants.

OSMOSIS, PLASMOLYSIS AND TYPES OF TISSUES MODE



Ms. Rekha Chib from Delhi Public School Jammu attended a webinar on the topic Osmosis, Plasmolysis and types of Tissues Mode: Virtual Duration. The resource person was Dr. Renu Deswal Professor, Department of Botany. The webinar was totally based on Osmosis and Plasmolysis. A single layer of plant cells is placed on a microscope slide and either distilled water or 5% sodium chloride solution is added to the cells. Osmosis will occur resulting in either turgid cells or plasmolysis cells. This was demonstrated by the resource persons through PPTs. The activity of Plasmolysis could be carried out by students working as

individuals or in pairs, depending on the number of microscopes available or small groups could use different concentrations of sodium chloride solution, and the students could inspect one another's slides. The activities shown by taking the examples of raisins that how the solute or solute moves from higher concentrations to lower concentrations.

SEMINAR ON BHASHA VIGYAN

INTEGRATING EVS IN PRIMARY SCHOOL



Ms. Sonam Sethi from Delhi Public School Jammu organized a webinar on the topic 'Integrating EVS in Primary School' organized by The DPSS HRDC held on July 29th, 2022. This session was conducted by Dr Mona Sedwal, an Assistant Professor at the Department of Training Professional Development and Education, National Institute of Educational Planning And Administration. She began her session by saying that she would be deliberating in terms of how to integrate EVS

and how to actually conceptualize the teaching of EVS. She said that it is very important to understand that EVS is not only one subject, but does a standalone subject comprise many subjects. She added that if we look at it more in the context of the policies, one of the major landmarks in the 1975 policy document is that a frame work was proposed for a single subject Environmental Studies at the primary stage. The first two years [class I - II] would look at both the natural and the social environment, while in classes III-V there would be separate portions for social studies and general science termed as EVS Part I and EVS Part II. India's national educational policy on education 1986 states there is a paramount need to create a consciousness of the environment. The National Policy on Education 1986 and the National Curriculum Framework 1988 also posted the same approach for the teaching of Environmental Studies at the primary stage. She highlighted that for integrating subjects for a new understanding, teachers working on an integrated approach should not proceed with lists of topics from different subjects, but instead propose themes that allow for a connected and inter-related understanding to develop. The Environmental Education introduced as EVS at the elementary education level has important objectives such as developing curiosity and awareness about the environment in children. The resource person added that a lesson plan is necessary to give guidelines for conducting learning activities. Dr Mona Sedwal concluded the session by saying that always be sensitive and flexible in relating the curriculum with daily activities to make it more interesting and relevant for children. She said that teachers must be attentive to the needs of all the children in the class. Overall, it was an informative and fruitful session that I really enjoyed. It provided us the useful information which would help us to clear the concepts with great precision.
