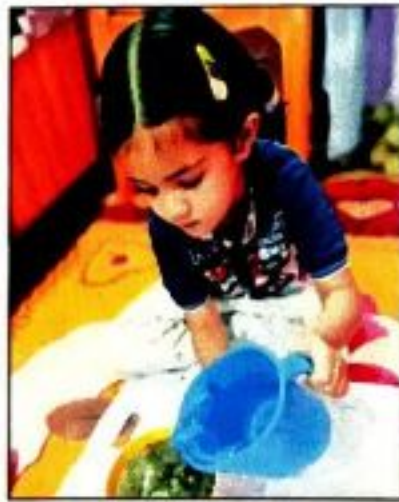

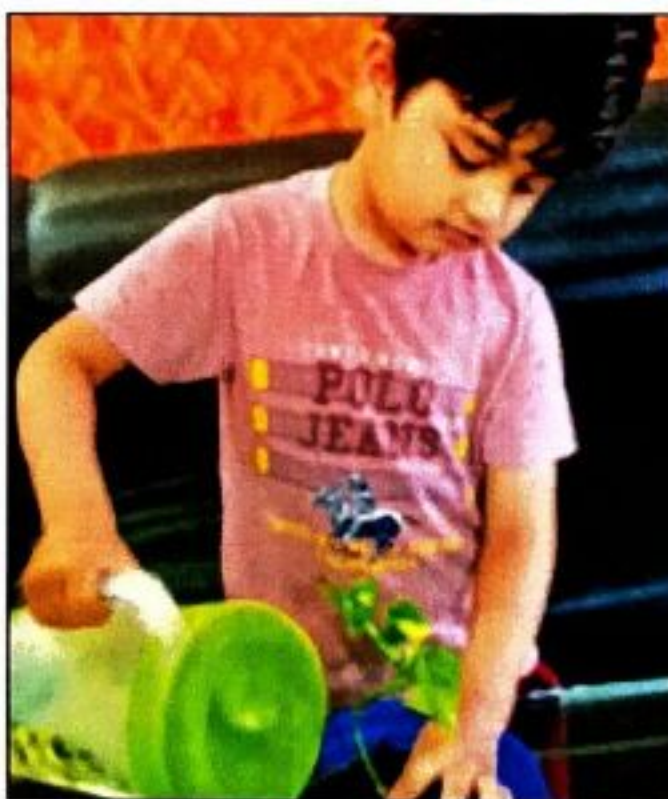

DPS JAMMU ORGANIZES VIRTUAL ASSEMBLY ON TEACHER'S DAY

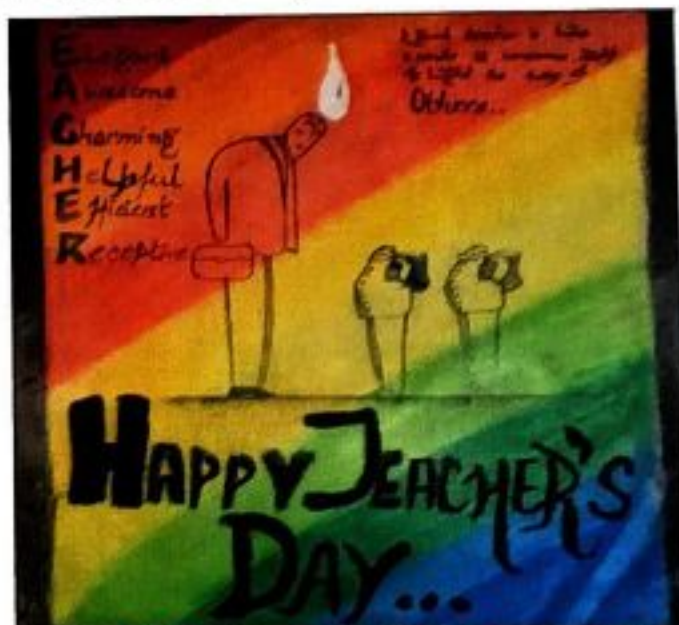

Dr. Radhakrishnan was born on September 17, 1889 in the village of Tiruchirappalli, Tamil Nadu. He was a philosopher, educationist, and statesman. He served as the second President of India from 1962 to 1967. He was also the first Vice-Chancellor of India's first university, the University of Madras, from 1918 to 1921. He was also the first Vice-Chancellor of the University of Andhra Pradesh from 1926 to 1930.

Happy Teacher's Day

In India, the Teacher's Day is celebrated on 5th September and this tradition started from 1962. This is the day when Dr. Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan was born. He was a philosopher, scholar, teacher, and politician, and his dedicated work towards education made him a truly an important day in the history of India.

A self-starter

Being a bright student, he completed his education winning scholarships, despite lack of finances. After completing his MA in Philosophy in 1910, Dr. Radhakrishnan taught the subject at Madras Presidency College. He then held the post of Vice-Chancellor of Andhra University from 1926 to 1930, followed by Vice-Chancellor of Banaras Hindu University (1930-34).

Dr. Sarvepalli Radhakrishnan was born on September 17, 1889 in the village of Tiruchirappalli, Tamil Nadu. He was a philosopher, educationist, and statesman. He served as the second President of India from 1962 to 1967. He was also the first Vice-Chancellor of India's first university, the University of Madras, from 1918 to 1921. 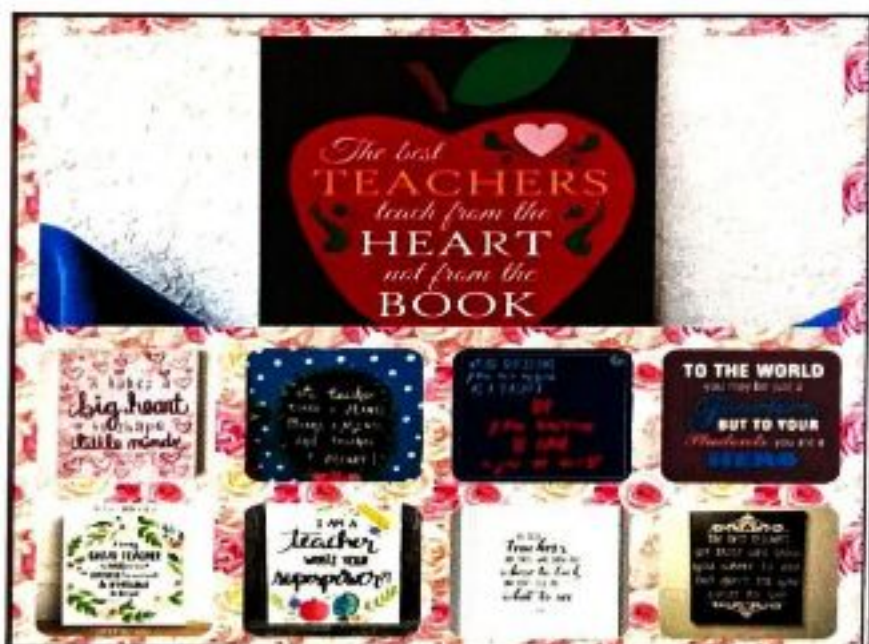
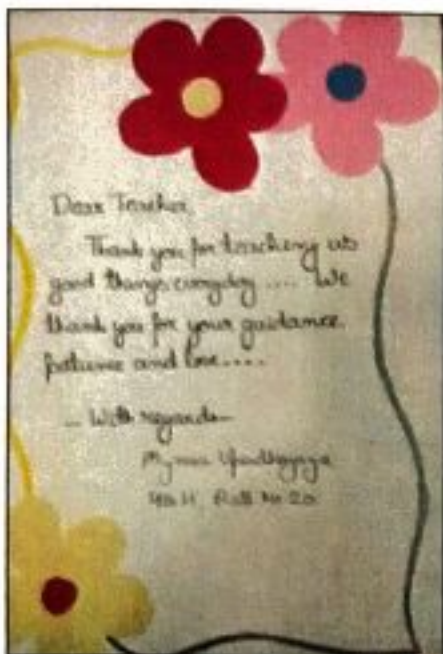
Story Behind Teacher's Day

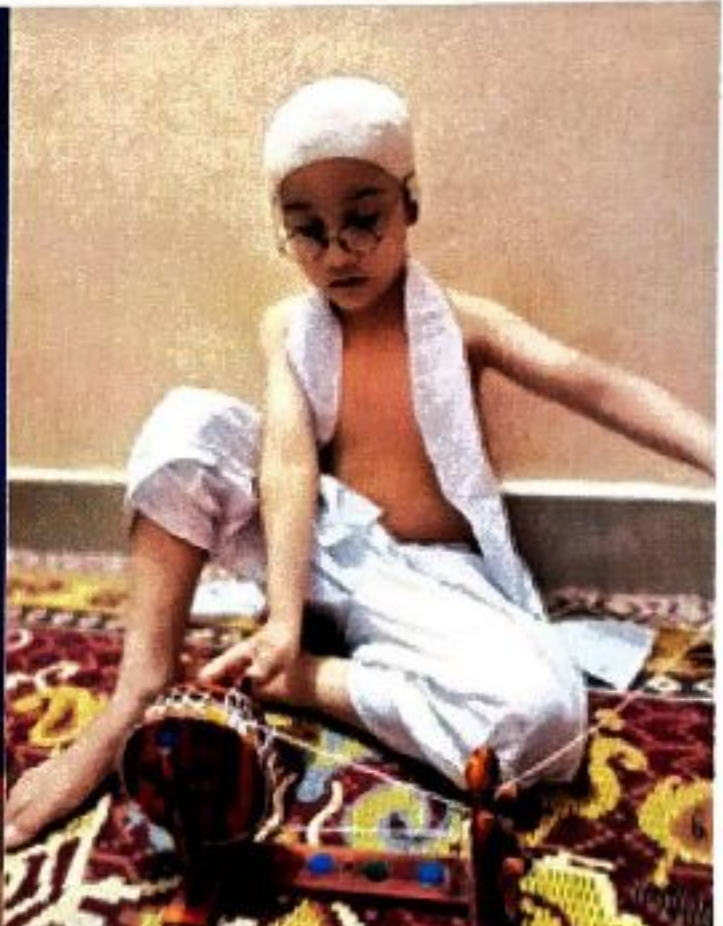


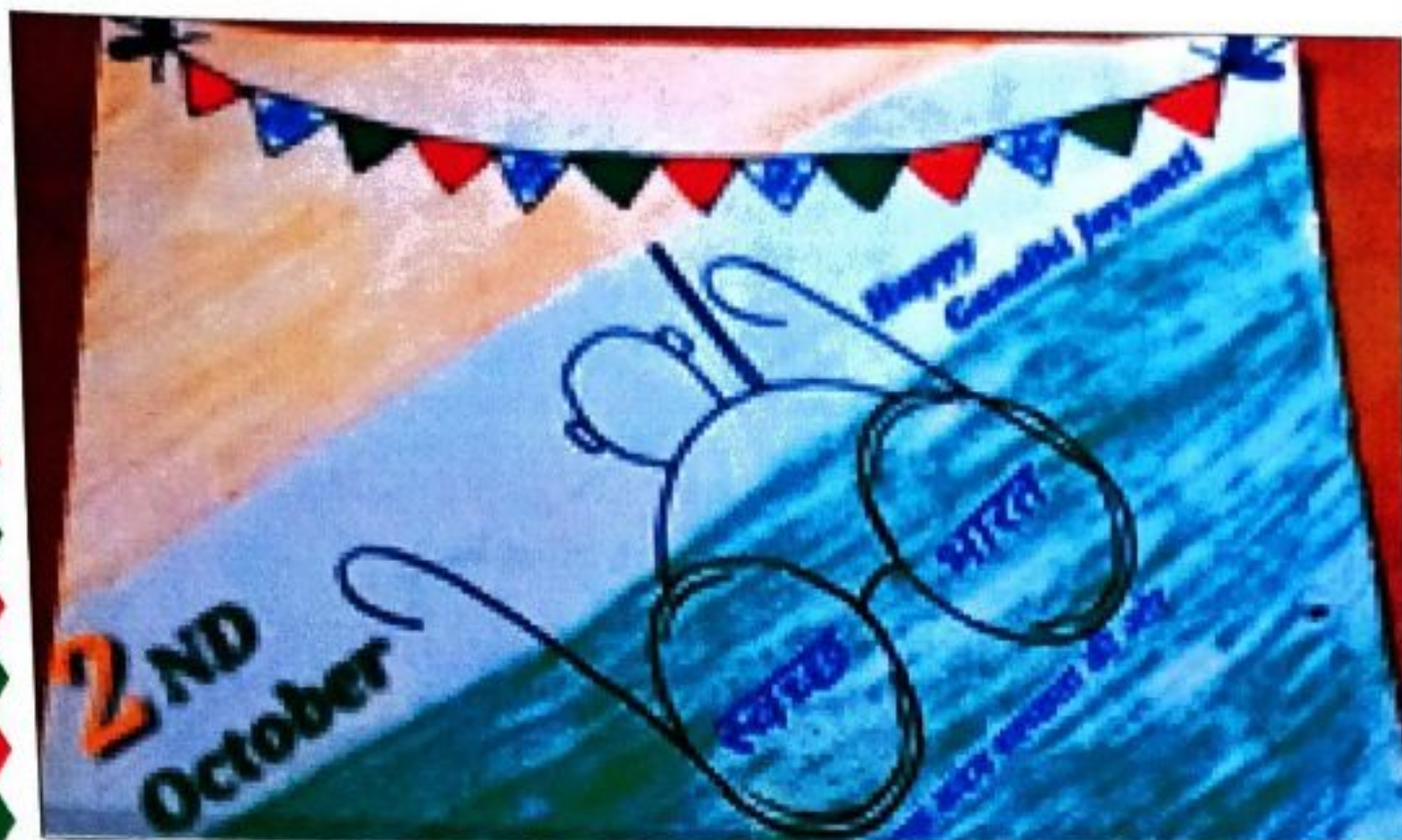
DPS JAMMU CELEBRATES VIRTUAL GANDHI JAYANTI

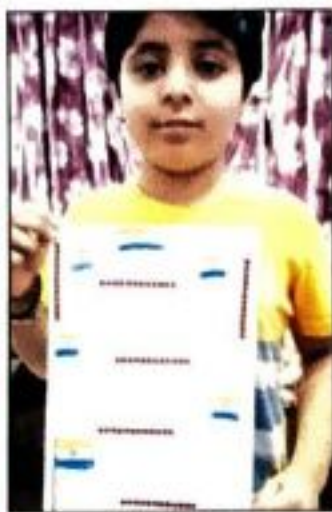

DPS JAMMU CELEBRATES VIRTUAL DUSSHERA

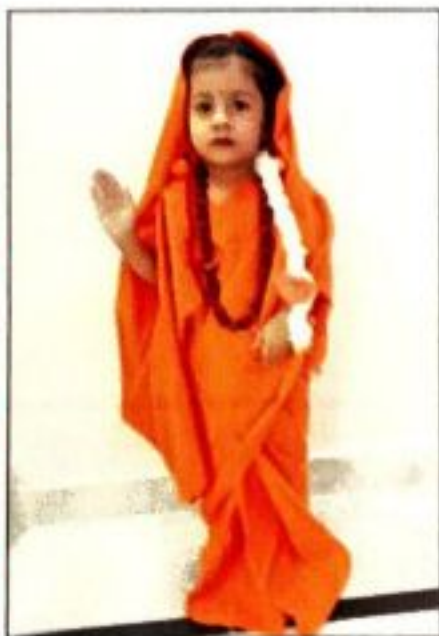

DPS JAMMU CELEBRATES VIRTUAL DIWALI

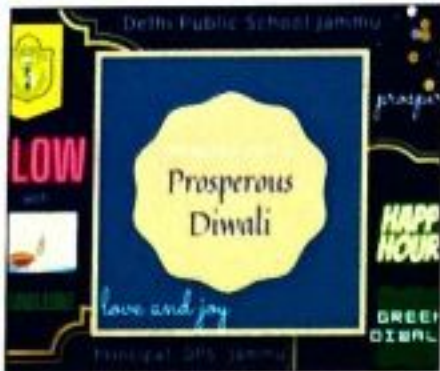

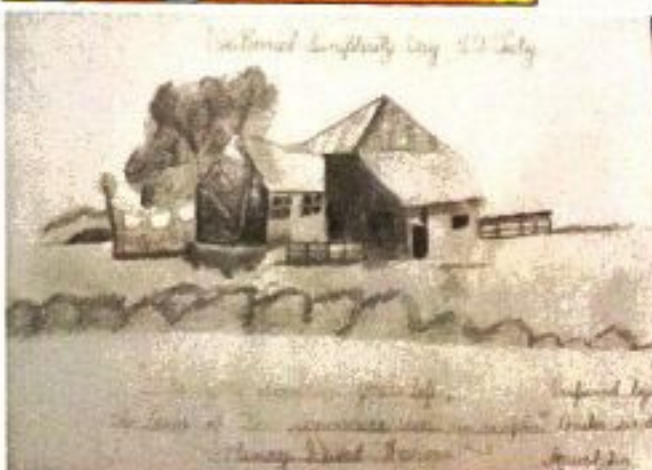

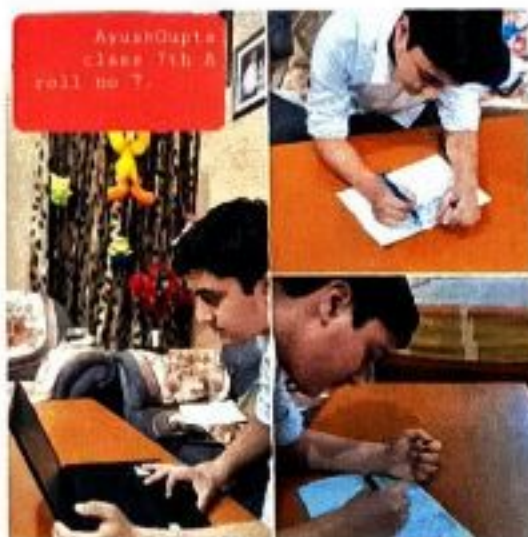
The Flipped Classroom is a Blended Learning Model in which traditional ideas about classroom activities and homework are reversed or "Flipped". In Flipped classes, students consume pre recorded classes, study material on their own while class-time is reversed for more active learning like projects and group discussions. Delhi Public School Jammu conducted holiday homework presentations in flipped classrooms from 13 July to 24 July 2021. Students were assigned study material based on the curriculum for self-study during vacations.

Based on that study material they were asked to perform experiments/activities, prepare project reports, make power point presentations, questionnaires and do script writing, slogan writing, etc. They presented their work in the virtual classes. The presentations of students were evaluated on various parameters like confidence, subject clarity and presentation skills. Earlier, Headmistress-DPS Jammu, Ms. Meenu Gupta presented the welcome address.

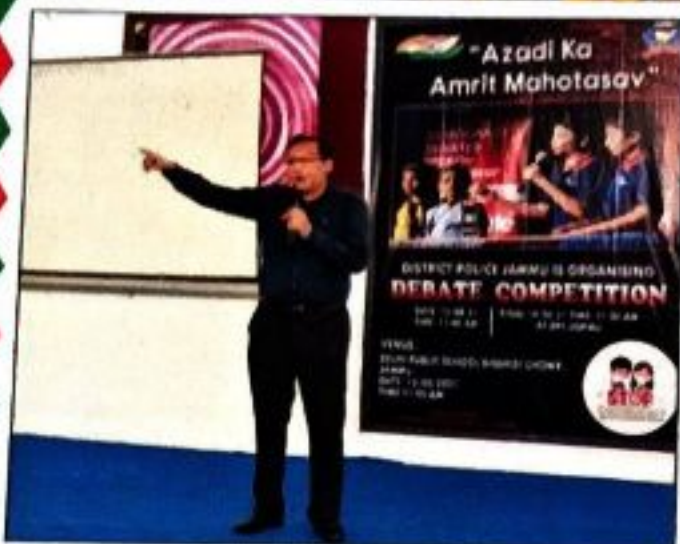
