As part of the joint venture between the Indian space Research Organisation (ISRO) and the Soviet Intercosmos Space Programme, Squadron Leader Rakesh Sharma, blasted into space on April 2, 1984. He was accompanied by the two other Soviet cosmonauts aboard the Soyuz T-11 spacecraft. The trio spent a total of eight days in space on the Salyut 7 space station. It was a proud moment for all Indians and for the Indian Space Research Organisation. But the proudest moment for Rakesh Sharma and indeed all Indians was when his conversation with the then Prime Minister of India, Smt. Indira Gandhi, was beamed live through satellite television to millions of Indians. The spacecraft was orbiting the earth, when positioned directly over India, Smt. Indira Gandhi asked his in Hindi 'How India appeared from outer space?' And in that unforgettable split second without hesitation and great pride in his voice Rakesh Sharma replied, 'Ji saare jahan se aacha,' quoting those famous lines from Iqbal's poem that never fail to sand a chill of thrill down every Indian's spine.
