TOPIC: TENSES

Verbs are often used in a way that it indicates or denotes the time when an event occurs. These verbs that take up different forms to indicate the time of an action, event or condition by changing its form are called as tenses. Tenses can be broadly classified into three broad categories:

- Past Tense
- Present Tense
- Future Tense

Each tense is divided into 4 types sub tense.

Present Tense

- Simple Present Tense/ Present Indefinite
- Present Continuous Tense
- Present Prefect Tense
- Present Prefect Continuous Tense

Past Tense

- Simple Past Tense / Past Indefinite
- Past Continuous Tense
- Past Perfect Tense
- Past Perfect Continuous Tense

Future Tense

- Simple Future / Future Indefinite Tense
- Future Continuous Tense
- Future Perfect Tense
- Future Perfect Continuous Tense.
