These girls are kept by themselves, and are regally fed and tended from birth. No other bees get such fine food as they get, or live such a high and luxurious life. By consequence they are larger and longer and sleeker than their working sister. And they have a curved sting, shaped like a scimitar, while the others have a straight one.
