The duckbill is like a fish, like a fowl, and like a reptile, yet it is not like any of them. It is an in-between animal that came about by evolution. Mammals nurse their young ones, and so does the duckbill. Reptiles and birds lay eggs, and so does the duckbill. The body temperature of a reptile changes with the heat or cold of its surroundings, and this also happens to the duckbill. Actually, the duckbill is a mammal, one of the only two mammals that lay eggs. The duckbill has a webbed feet and a duck like bill instead of a mouth. It swims in the water somewhat like a fish. It is found only in the eastern portion of Australia and in Tasmania. The body of a duckbill is covered with a fine under fur hidden by a coat of long, coarse guard hairs. It has a flat tail, somewhat like a beaver's. The duckbill can hear well, even though it looks as if it has no ears. The duckbill cannot breathe underwater, so it must keep its bill in the air while it swims. This peculiar animal keeps its home in burrows on the banks of quiet, deep pools in rivers. Duckbills stay in the burrow most of the day and come out only at night to feed in the water. They eat water insects, worms and shellfish.
