Students from places as distant as China, Greece, Arabia, Africa and Central Asia came to this great land to educate themselves in various arts and sciences—mathematics, astronomy, logic, philosophy, theology, sculpture, music, medicine, surgery and chemistry. Universities such as

Taxila, Vikramshila and Nalanda had
a global repute so much so that
