





DPS Jammu was awarded overall Number 1 CBSE School in J&K and Number 1 School in Jammu City in a survey conducted by Education Today at the 'India School Merit Awards- 2016' ceremony held at Bangalore on 10 Dec. 2016 for serving the state with quality education for two decades and for its exemplary contribution to the field of education. The Principal, Ms. Ruchi Chabra was conferred with these two awards for Delhi Public School, Jammu at a glittering ceremony held at Chancellory Pavallion, Bangalore on 10th December, 2016. These awards are based on Jury Rating, Parents' Votes (28,510 votes) & Education Today Co's Team Analysis (Perception based). Christmas Celebrations











-Uttar Pradesh. He also received the award of Honour from Viraj Kala Kendra, Jammu.
















NATIONAL LEVEL PAINTING COMPETITION












NATIONAL THEATRE FESTIVAL
