## EXAMINATION AND PROMOTION POLICY FOR CLASSES III-V

### A. Scholastic Area

- 1. There will be 2 terms carrying 100 marks each, which will include the following :
- (a) Periodic Assessments (b) 1 Half Yearly Examination (c) 1 Annual Examination First Term (April-September): Periodic Assessment 1 + Half Yearly Examination Second Term (October-March): Periodic Assessment 2 + Annual Examination
  - (a) Periodic Assessments: The Periodic Assessments carrying weightage of 20 marks each would be conducted twice a year. It would include Periodic Tests, Subject Enrichment Activities and Notebook Submission, as follows:
    - (i) P.T.'s: There would be Two Periodic Tests (P.T.'s) in the entire academic year.

These will be conducted as: Periodic Test-1 in July, Periodic Test-2 in December, with portion of syllabus cumulatively covered. The gradually increasing portion of contents would help students gain confidence for appearing in the Annual examination. These P.T's would carry 50 marks each.

(ii) S.E.A.: Subject Enrichment Activities (S.E.A.) will be conducted twice a year as follows: English/Hindi-Assessment of Speaking & Listening Skills (ASL), Mathematics/EVS/Computer-Project, Lab Activities, etc. These S.E.A's

would carry 05 marks each.

(iii) N.B.S: Notebook Submission (N.B.S.) will be done on the following parameters:

(a) Regularity (b) Punctuality (c) Notebook upkeep (d) Work done

(e) Assignment Completion. This would carry 05 marks.

In addition to the above, there would be minimum two class tests conducted per subject in each term.

- (b) Half Yearly Examination: Half Yearly (Written) Examination carrying weightage of 80 marks would be conducted in the month of September, which would include the entire syllabus covered since April till the date notified.
- (c) Annual Examination: Annual (Written) Examination carrying weightage of 80 marks would be conducted in the month of March, which would include syllabus covered since April as per the following weightage: 10% of 1st Term, covering significant topics + entire syllabus of 2nd Term. Calculation of the Final Result :-

20% of the Periodic Assessments

80% of Yearly Examination

Note: Parents to ensure that their wards appear in the periodic tests according to the dates mentioned in the school almanac. Children should score minimum 40% in Class Tests, Periodic Tests, Half Yearly & Annual Examination in their own better academic interest.

### B. Co Scholastic Area

Following Areas will be graded :

Work Education (Social, Economic & Welfare activities), Art, Health & Physica Education, GK, Aptitude, Dance/Music/Theatre, Discipline (Attendance, Sincerity Behaviour, Values, Tidiness, Respectfulness for rules & regulations, Attitude towards society, nation & others).

2. The grading in the above Areas will be done on a 3 point grading scale

(A = Outstanding, B = Very Good and C = Fair).

### **EXAMINATION AND PROMOTION POLICY FOR CLASSES VI-VIII**

#### A. Scholastic Area

- There will be 2 terms carrying 100 marks each, which will include the following:

   (a) Periodic Assessments (b) 1 Half Yearly Examination (c) 1 Annual Examination
   First Term (April-September): Periodic Assessment 1 + Half Yearly Examination
   Second Term (October-March): Periodic Assessment 2 + Annual Examination
  - (a) Periodic Assessments: The Periodic Assessments carrying weightage of 20 marks each would be conducted twice a year. It would include Periodic Tests, Subject Enrichment Activities and Notebook Submission, as follows:
    - (i) P.T.'s: There would be Two Periodic Tests (P.T.'s) in the entire academic year.

These will be conducted as: Periodic Test-1 in July, Periodic Test-2 in December, with portion of syllabus cumulatively covered. The gradually increasing portion of contents would help students gain confidence for appearing in the Annual examination. These P.T's would carry 50 marks each.

- (ii) S.E.A.: Subject Enrichment Activities (S.E.A.) will be conducted twice a year as follows: English/Hindi/IIIrd Lang-Assessment of Speaking & Listening Skills (ASL), Science / Mathematics/S.St./Computer-Project, Lab Activities/Map Work, etc. These S.E.A's would carry 05 marks each.
- (iii) N.B.S: Notebook Submission (N.B.S.) will be done on the following parameters:
  - (a) Regularity (b) Punctuality (c) Notebook upkeep (d) Work done
  - (e) Assignment Completion. This would carry 05 marks.

In addition to the above, there would be minimum two class tests conducted per subject in each term.

- (b) Half Yearly Examination: Half Yearly (Written) Examination carrying weightage of 80 marks would be conducted in the month of September, which would include the entire syllabus covered since April till the date notified.
- (c) Annual Examination: Annual (Written) Examination carrying weightage of 80 marks would be conducted in the month of March, which would include syllabus covered since April as per the following class-wise weightage: Class VI: 10% of 1st Term, covering significant topics + entire syllabus of 2nd Term. Class VII: 20% of 1st Term, covering significant topics + entire syllabus of 2nd Term. Class VIII: 30% of 1st Term, covering significant topics + entire syllabus of 2nd Term.

Calculation of the Final Result :-

20% of the Periodic Assessments

80% of Yearly Examinations

  - (a) Periodic Assessments (b) 1 Half Yearly Examination (c) 1 Annual Examination First Term (April-September): Periodic Assessment 1 + Half Yearly Examination Second Term (October-March): Periodic Assessment 2 + Annual Examination
  - (a) Periodic Assessments: The Periodic Assessments carrying weightage of 20 marks each would be conducted twice a year. It would include Periodic Tests, Subject Enrichment Activities and Notebook Submission, as follows:
    - (i) P.T.'s: There would be Two Periodic Tests (P.T.'s) in the entire academic year.

These will be conducted as: Periodic Test-1 in July, Periodic Test-2 in December, with portion of syllabus cumulatively covered. The gradually increasing portion of contents would help students gain confidence for appearing in the Annual examination. These P.T's would carry 50 marks each.

- (c) Annual Examination: Annual (Written) Examination carrying weightage of 80 marks would be conducted in the month of March, which would include syllabus covered since April 2017.

Calculation of the Final Result :-

20% of the Periodic Assessments 80% of Yearly Examination

Note: Children should score minimum 40% in Class Tests, Periodic Tests, Half Yearly & Annual Examination in their own better academic interest.

#### A. Scholastic Area

- I. There will be 3 terms carrying 100 marks each and 1 Annual Exam of 80 marks. Each term will comprise of Internal Assessment (50 marks) and Periodic Test (50 marks) for each subject.
- II. 50 marks of Internal Assessment in each subject will be divided as follows:
  - (i) S.E.A.

    Subject Enrichment Activities (S.E.A.) will be conducted as follows:

    English/Hindi Assessment of Speaking & Listening Skills (ASL), Science,

    Mathematics / S.ST Project, Lab Activities / Map Work, etc.
  - (ii) N.B.S

    Marking for Notebook Submission (N.B.S.) will be done on the following parameters:
    - (a) Regularity (b) Punctuality (c) Notebook upkeep (d) Work done (e) Assignment Completion
  - (iii) C.T.

    Two class tests (C.T.) of 20 marks each will be conducted per subject.

### III. Periodic Tests

There would be three Periodic Tests in the entire academic year and the average of the best two will be taken. These will be conducted as: Periodic Test-1 in July, Periodic Test 2 (Half Yearly) in October, Periodic Test-3 in December, with portion of syllabus cumulatively covered. The gradually increasing portion of contents would help students gain confidence for appearing in the Pre Board-1 in December, Pre Board-2 in January and the Board Examination in March with 100% syllabus.

the streams, such as

English - Assessment of Speaking & Listening Skills (ASL), Debates, Declamation, Panel Discussion, etc.

Physics/Chemistry/Biology/Mathematics/History/Geography/Political Science/Economics/B.St./Accountancy-Project, Lab Activities/Map Work, etc.
